

How to play

- 1. Each player begins with 4 pawns (1 for each category) and 1 shared dice. Use the pawns from other board games you have at home; tiny objects such as colored pebbles, paper clips or pennies will also do. Equally, borrow the dice from another game or use a virtual one at freeonlinedice.com.
- 2. Reflect on the questions in the Dreams and Nightmares section at the bottom of this board and familiarize yourselves with the 4 categories in the columns: Food, Transportation, Energy, Manufacturing by reading the descriptions.
- 3. Place your pawns on the bottom row (1 in each category) where it says "Start here". The youngest player rolls the dice first.
- 4. The dice indicates how many fields you can move up. With every roll you can only move 1 pawn up in 1 category. Choose the category wisely and follow the instructions in the fields you land on.
- 5. A player needs to roll the exact number to reach the top row where it says "You made it". If a higher number is rolled, the player will move back down.
- 6. If the instructions in a field say "move down" or "move up" the player has to move the pawn in that same category. The same goes for the second player who is invited to "move up" along with player one.
- 7. The player who has all 4 pawns at the top wins.

Best with: 2-4 players, 7-11 y.o.



A furniture manufacturer in your town replanted a forest and helped reverse a drought. Move up 1 field.




You recycle your waste. Move up 1 field.
